REGISTRATION AND VISA PROCESS

Once nominated, we send students a letter offering them a place on the UCT GSB exchange programme, a UCT GSB application form for completion, and an information pack including course information.

The UCT GSB is prohibited from registering foreign students unless they are in possession of a valid visa for South Africa for the duration of their study period. It is every student's own responsibility to ensure that they are in possession of a valid visa to enter South Africa before travelling. We advise all students to contact their nearest South African Embassy or Consulate before travelling to South Africa, in order to confirm visa requirements. 
Students from visa exempt countries, entering South Africa for three months/90 days or less, may enter on a Visitor's Visa with an endorsement stating that they are studying at the UCT GSB. A list of visa exempt countries is available on the South African Department of Home Affairs website:

http://www.dha.gov.za/index.php/ immigration-services/exempt-countries Students from non-visa exempt countries, however, are issued a Study Visa for the duration of their studies in South Africa. These students need to make an application for the visa through their nearest South African Embassy or Consulate in their home country as no visas are issued at a South African Port of Entry.

Study Visas are required for all foreign students intending to study at a learning institution in South Africa for longer than three months. Students must apply for a South African Study Visa through their nearest South African Embassy, Consulate or Trade Mission, and should include a copy of the admissions letter offering them a place at the UCT GSB, together with a brief motivation of their reasons for wanting to study in South Africa.

Visa applications take a minimum of 8-10 weeks to process in the case of complete applications (all documentation in English) meeting all the requirements. Students should therefore ensure that they obtain the list of required documentation from their nearest SA foreign mission and start collecting their supporting information well in advance. Upon receipt of their UCT GSB Admissions Letter they should immediately submit their visa application for timeous processing.





HEALTH CARE

STUDY PERMITS: HEALTH COVER

One of the requirements of a study permit is proof of medical cover that is registered in and/or recognised in South Africa. You may select any medical aid scheme (NOT medical insurance) registered in South Africa and shown as "open" on this <u>list by the council of medical schemes</u>. We recommend the following because they provide the best cover for international students and offer the best value for money:

SOUTH AFRICAN HEALTHCARE CONSULTANTS

UCT has appointed ACA Employee Benefits (Pty) Ltd (ACA Healthcare) – a division of Sanlam - who are specialist health cover intermediaries, to assist international students with obtaining appropriate medical cover. ACA Healthcare, together with IEASA do an annual evaluation of available schemes and make clear proposals to universities around the most appropriate schemes, against the background of a wide range of criteria, including financial stability, benefits, costs and service offering.

LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

English

CLASS FORMAT

Lectures, group work, discussions, case studies, and presentations.

ATTENDANCE

Class attendance is mandatory, except where permission is granted by the programme convenor

PARTICIPATION

Active participation is encouraged and may form part of each student's grade (5-10%). Much of the course work is carried out in groups, preparing students for the challenges of managing and being part of a team. Skills such as team-building, communication, delegation, negotiation and conflict resolution are honed through group interaction.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Elective courses are offered each year depending on student interests, and our offering changes from year to year.

For Term 1, exchange students take electives separately from GSB students.

There is no Term 2.

For Terms 3 and 4, exchange students take electives with GSB students.

Both terms are made up of 2-week teaching blocks (for online learning there may be an additional week before and after for preparation and assessment, respectively).

GRADING

The final course grade varies from class to class, but may be based on the following: Class participation, individual assignments, group projects, oral and written presentations, midterm tests, final examination or term paper.

See UCT's grading table to the right, which we issue with your final transcript. This is intended as a guide to your home university. Please do note that grade conversion varies from one university to another. It is up to your home institution to convert your grades into their system.

LOCATION

FACILITIES

Centrally located and easily accessed, the UCT GSB is just 1.5km away from the central business district and 20 minutes from Cape Town International Airport.

The Breakwater Campus, once a 19th century prison, is equipped with modern lecture theatres and syndicate rooms for group study, as well as a library and restaurants. Our teaching venues are world-class. The campus also offers a new Solution Space environment specially designed to foster creativity and collaboration with floor-to-ceiling chalkboard walls, flexible furniture for multiple set-ups, hot desk facilities, lounge areas, a computer lab (e-mail, internet and Wi-Fi), an open learning space including video conferencing facilities for virtual meet-ups and presentations.

Our state-of-the-art Academic Conference Centre, opened in 2019, was specifically planned to conform to the requirements of a technologically advanced era in academic and research circles. Additionally, our satellite site in the community of Philippi, one of Cape Town's poorest suburbs, offers students, alumni, clients and local entrepreneurs a place to meet and engage, and to exchange skills and ideas. It was established in a deliberate effort to deepen our roots and relevance as an African business school. Our teaching, learning and research is directed towards building a more economically prosperous, equitable and integrated continent.

ACCOMMODATION

RESIDENCE ON OUR BREAKWATER CAMPUS

The Protea Breakwater Lodge, on the UCT GSB campus features 18 conference venues, four public lounges, gym, spa, business centre, 24-hour secure parking with 250 parking bays, and offers airport transfers and laundry service.

The hotel boasts 191 modern environmentally conscious rooms with standard rooms, business suites and family units. All rooms are equipped with minibar fridge, free uncapped Wi-Fi, tea/coffee facilities, air-conditioning, LCD flat screen TV, telephone and laptop-friendly electronic safes.
